

I, Clinton Dowell of the County of Breckinridge and State of Kentucky, do make this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking any and all former will's I may have made.

I give and devise to my beloved wife Lettia J. Dowell in lieu of her former the farm on which we now reside, except 50 acres of land on the south end of the farm which I have bargained and sold this day to my son Floyd at \$12.00 per acre, payable and to be paid as follows \$300 payable 1st day of January 1912, \$100 due and payable 1st day of January 1913, \$100 due and payable 1st day of Jan'y 1914, the remaining \$100 due and payable 1st day of January 1915, all of the four said notes to bear 6 per cent interest from date until paid, situate in the County of Breckinridge and containing 175 acres less the 50 acres this day contracted and sold to my son Floyd, during her widow-hood and all the house-hold goods, stock, furniture and provisions and all other personal property which may be thereon at the time of my decease, during her widow-hood as aforesaid; she however being directed to sell, so much of the perishable property as may be sufficient to pay my just debts. At the expiration of my said wife's widowhood or death the real estate aforesaid I give and bequeath to my 10 children, Floyd R; Carrie Eula (Miller); Ernest B; Hattie Z; Herbert R; Gilbert H; Leatha E; Richard D; Clyde C and Pauline B. Dowell in equal shares, should there remain at the death of my said wife or her widowhood any of the personal property, upon said farm then I will and devise the same to my said children in the same manner.

All the rest of my estate, both real and personal of whatever nature or kind it may be, I desire may be equally divided among my several children hereinbefore named which I give to them their heirs, executors and assigns forever.

I do hereby constitute my wife Lettia J. Executrix of this my last will and testament.
