Fourth I give to Walter S. Beecher the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty (\$250.) Dollars

Fifth I give to Fred W. Sulzer Louisville Ky the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty (\$250.) Dollars

Sixth

I give to my niece Eloise W. Walte the sum of One Thousand (\$1000.) Dollars

Seventh I give to my sister - in - law Mrs. Annie W. Walte the wife of Julius C. Walte Cloverport Ky the sum of One Thousand (\$1000.) Dollars

Eighth

All the residue of my Estate after the foregoing bequest, I give to my brother Julius C. Walte

Ninth

I also request my executor to dispose of my stocks if any to the best advantage

Tenth

I nominate & appoint my brother Julius C. Walte as executor of this my last will & testament and desire that he be permitted to qualify as such without bond.
