

I, Alfred Allen, of the County of Breckinridge and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing memory, and desiring to make a different disposition of my property from that which would be made by law should I die intestate, do make, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking any and all wills I may have heretofore made:

Ic It is my will and desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses shall first be paid out of my personal estate

IId I will and bequeath all the rest, residue and remainder on my estate, of whatever character, to my beloved wife, Caroline Allen, during her natural life time. She shall have full power and authority to use and enjoy all the personalty of my estate, or sell any or all of the same and use the proceeds thereof, if necessary in her judgment, to enable her to enjoy the comforts of life; but she shall not have the right to sell the realty, but she shall enjoy the rents and profits derived therefrom as long as she shall live, and she may occupy the same:

IIId After the death of my wife, her funeral expenses shall first be paid; and when this shall have been done, all the remainder of the personal estate, if any, shall be equally divided between my two sons, Tzaddie Allen and Joseph T. Allen. The real estate I purchased of M.W. Robbins and R.F. Beard shall become the absolute property in fee simple, of my son, Joseph T. Allen. The real estate deeded to me by Hardin Robbins and Allen ReKincheloe shall become the absolute property in fee simple, of my son, Tzaddie Allens

It is proper for me to state that the reason I have not made any provision in this will for my daughter, Frances Jane Roberts, is that I have made advancements to her:

IVc I hereby appoint my wife, Caroline Allen, executrix of this will, and request that she be permitted to qualify as such hereunder, without being required to execute bonds
