Last Will and Testament of ~~Frank~~ F. Rhodes
 I, F. F. Rhodes being of sound mind and in the full possession of all my faculties, do make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former former wills and codicils. After all of my personal debts are paid, which I wish to specify, including my burial expense and last sickness, Forty Dollars (\$40.00) due on bond out in Owensboro, Kentucky to Hodson agent for the owner of house on Seventh Street, or was the owner on or about the years 1909, 1910 or 1911. Same house as occupied in the named years by F. F. Rhodes and E. H. Rhodes. To be paid to the proper party or his estate. And to Alice McClellan the balance on note given to him by Dillon and Rhodes, signed by F. F. Rhodes and by Patrick Dillon upon which has been paid by Dillon twenty dollars (\$20.00) and by Rhodes (\$30.00) up to this date. And to the creditors of the estate of J. Gabriel Mollingly, the sum of sixty or seventy dollars, when these debts, with their just accretments are paid, I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Mary A. Rhodes all of my estate both personal and real ~~estate~~ which includes in this provision all of my life Insurance Policy without reservation and the whole of my estate, real and personal and all personal property including all notes and accounts and cash on hand or all may be due me.

I desire and will after my death that all of the aforesaid property shall be converted into cash and the whole of the principle I will shall be placed on interest, the interest exclusive of the principle, I will shall be paid to my wife the aforesaid Mary A. Rhodes so long as she remains my widow, provided that this interest is sufficient to maintain her in comfort. Should it not prove sufficient, for her maintenance, then I will that the deficiency, by agreement of my

and heirs hereafter
named shall be taken
from the privilege
and this together
with the interest
paid to the one
heirs, delects
to take the prop-
erty of their mother
Mary A. Rhodes.
Should my wife
Mary A. Rhodes,
my wife, I will
that my whole es-
tate both personal
and real and
whatever interest
on the same that
has accrued by
lawfully divided
between my five
children: A

five children, viz; Edward A Rhodes, Kendrick B. Rhodes,
Mary Osa (Rhodes) McClellan, J. Bernard Rhodes, and
Dennis Rhodes shall receive a sum equal to one
fifth of my whole estate less the amount he has al-
ready received over and above the other four
children and heirs. My daughter Mary Osa (Rhodes) Mc-
Clellan shall receive a sum equal to one fifth of
my whole estate. My son J. Bernard Rhodes shall re-
ceive a sum equal to one fifth of my whole estate.
And my son Dennis Rhodes shall receive a sum
equal to one-fifth of my whole estate.
Should my wife Mary A. Rhodes at her death be
my widow, I desire and will that my whole estate
shall be equally divided among my five heirs as
aforesaid.

I desire and will that fifty (\$50⁰⁰) Dollars
shall be set aside for masses for the repose of my
soul. Said sum of money to be paid by my Ex-
ecutor to any Catholic Priest selected by him.

I will that before any division of my
estate shall be made at the death of my wife
Mary A. Rhodes, she being my widow, the sum
of fifty (\$50⁰⁰) shall be set aside for masses
for the repose of her soul to be paid by my Executor
to any Catholic priest selected by him.

I hereby appoint my son Edward A Rhodes
as Executor of my will without Bond. Should he
fail to qualify then I appoint my son Kendrick B.
Rhodes as my Executor of my will without
Bond, Should both fail to qualify then I appoint
my son J. Bernard Rhodes as my Executor of
my will without Bond.

This shall be the portion of my whole
estate that each of heirs shall receive and
no more.
