I, Frank Fraize, of Cloverport, Kentucky, declare this Instrument to be my Will.

(1) I will, devise and bequeath all of my estate, real, personal and mixed jointly to my wife and son Fred W. Fraize and at my death should either be dead, then the ~~same~~ shall have the entire estate.

(2) I request that no inventory of my estate shall be requested of my executor because of the faith I have in the ~~integrity~~ of my son Fred W. Fraize, who I nominate Executor of my estate and I request the County Court ~~where~~ where my Will shall be probated, not to require any bond of him as such executor.

In witness whereof, I have hereunto signed my name to ~~this~~ this Will, the terms and conditions of which are written as dictated by me, all of which I fully understand, and I have signed same in the presence of Wilbur Chapin and Claude Mercer, each of whom, signed his name hereto as attesting witnesses in my presence.

I now appoint and request the County Court of Breckinridge County to confirm by its appointment, my wife to be executrix of my estate, and that she be permitted to qualify without giving bond and I further request that no inventory or appraisalment of my estate shall be requested or made by her.
