

WILL OF Frank L. Walker.

I, Frank L. Walker being of sound mind and disposing memory and realizing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death, do make this my last will and testament.

Item 1. I request that after my death, all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid, and stone marker be placed at my grave similar to those at the graves of my two wives.

Item 2. I have six heirs as follows—Oce, who intermarried with Allen Elder, Felix La. Rey, Adrian, Lewis, and Ethel Kiser only child and heir of Edith Hawkins who is dead.

Item 3. I have one house and lot in Cleversert, Kentucky., known as the Bischoff property, which I Give and bequeath to my daughter, Oce Elder absolutely, and in fee simple, she is my only daughter and is more in need of my help than my other children.

Item 4. It is then my will that all personal property and real estate, be sold by my executor hereinafter named at as early a date as can be after the sale has been well advertised, and that the proceeds of the sale together with all other personalty, that I may have be divided into six equal parts, my son Felix being deaf and dumb, and otherwise afflicted, I will and bequeath the one sixth, that should fall to him, shall go to my daughter Oce to be held by her in trust for the support and maintenance of my said son Felix, and in the event the said Felix should die before my said daughter Oce, then whatever of his estate is left, shall go absolutely to my said daughter Oce, the other five sixths of my estate shall go one sixth each to my remaining five children absolutely.

Item 5. I Give my executor hereinafter named full power to convey all real estate sold under this will, to the purchaser thereof by a Good and sufficient deed.

Item 6. It is my request that an inventory be made of my estate.

Item 7. I nominate for appointment by the Court as my executor my son Lewis Of Laramie Wyoming and in the event he can not or does not qualify then I nominate for said appointment my daughter Oce Elder of LeGanssert Indiana, and it is my desire that either of them shall act without bond.
