

I, G. W. Hylton of LaHant, Co of Breckinridge, State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and memory, do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say.

1. It is my will that my funeral shall be conducted with-out ostentation, and that the expenses thereof together with all my just debts be fully paid, and the grave-yard shall be nicely enclosed with wire fencing therefor and also Tomb stones shall be placed at the grave of P. C. Hylton and G. W. Hylton

2. I give and devise to my only son Henry Benjamin Hylton the farm on which he now resides situated in Breckinridge Co, Kentucky, and containing One Hundred and Fifty-eight acr 158 acres, or there-about to his heirs and assigns forever.

3. I give and devise to my only daughter Sarah Jeonettie Hylton an interest of Twenty-two Hundred dollars in my farm situated Wise Co, Virginia, containing Four Hundred acres 400 acre more or less to her the said Sarah-Jeonettie Hylton her heirs and assigns in fee simple.

4. And then when my tract of land is sold in Wise Co, Va above stated and Sarah Jeonettie Hylton then receives her Twenty-two Hundred dollars \$2200. dollars interest out of the said land, then the remainder to be equally divided between Henry Benjamin Hylton and Sarah Jeonettie Hylton.

5. and last I hereby constitute and appoint my said heirs Henry Benjamin Hylton and Sarah Jeonettie Hylton, to be the Executor and Executrin of this my last will and testament revoking and annulling all former wills by me made and ratified and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament.
