

Will of Henry H. Davis.

I, Henry H. Davis, of Irvington, County of Breckinridge and State of Kentucky, being of full age and sound mind and memory, do make, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament.

FIRST, I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate as soon as practicable after the time of my decease.

SECOND, I give, bequeath and devise to my daughter, Sallie A. Bechtold, the sum of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars in cash provided she survives me, but, should she die before me, in lieu whereof of this bequest I give and devise to my Grand-Daughter, Elizabeth Jennings (Daughter of the said Sallie A. Bechtold,) the sum of Fifty (\$50.00)

THIRD, All the remainder of my property, real or personal of every kind and description, wheresoever situate, which I may own or have the right to dispose of at the time of my decease, I give, bequeath and devise to my beloved wife, Luella A. Davis, and my daughter, Ruth Henry Davis, absolutely and in fee simple, they to share alike in the same.

Fourth, I make, nominate and appoint my wife, Luella A. Davis to be the Executrix of this my last will and testament and I request that no bond be required of her as such, I further request that no inventory be made or taken, in as far as the same may be lawfully omitted.
