

WILL OF H. J. KREBS.

IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN.

I, H. J. Krebs of Irvington in the County of Breckinridge, State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and memory and considering the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life, do therefore make, ordain, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament.

FIRST, I order and direct that my Executrix hereinafter named, pay all my just debts and funeral expenses as soon after my decease as conveniently may be,

SECOND, After the payment of such funeral expenses and debts, I Give, devise and bequeath to my sister Mrs Amelia Reeder the sum of One Hundred dollars, (\$100.00) in cash,

THIRD, All the rest, residue, and remainder of my real and personal estate of whatsoever kind or nature, I Give, devise, and bequeath to my wife Mary E. Krebs, her heirs and assigns forever.

LASTLY, I make, constitute and appoint Mary E. Krebs my wife, without bond to be Executrix of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me made.
