

Third: The rest of my estate I desire equally divided between the children of my deceased husband, viz: Mary Aiken, Hannah T. Hayes, Clara Beard, Morena L. Kirchels, Adeline M. Beckridge, Allen M. Kirchels, Kate B. Stith, and Ellen Kirchels, and if either of them should die before I do, I desire their part to go to his or her children or heirs.

Fourth: I hereby appoint Morris Beckridge as my executor, and as I have confidence in his integrity and honesty I request the Court not to require security of him.
