

WILL OF James Durham,

I, James Durham of Hardinsburg, County of Breckenridge and State of Ky., being of full age and of sound mind and memory, do make, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all wills by me heretofore made.

FIRST, I direct that all my Just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate as soon as practicable after the time of my decease.

SECOND, All the property, real and personal of every kind and description wheresoever situate, which I may own or have the right to dispose of at the time of my decease, I Give, bequeath and devise to my heirs at law ^{namely} children and Grand children, said children being as follows, Charlie Durham, Vess Durham, Ida Perkins and Cova Glasseck and my Grand child being Edith Ziegeler the said children and Grand-child to share in same equally, but each to be charged with advancements already made or hereafter made by me to them.

THIRD, I make, nominate and appoint the Farmers Bank & Trust Co., of Hardinsburg, Ky., to be the executor of this, my last will and testament and I direct the court to allow them 2 per cent on all property, and notes except Bonds and cash that pass through their hands, and said Trust Co., agrees to accept said trust on these terms.
