

Will of James N. Payne.

I, James N. Payne, of Hardin County of Breckinridge, and state of Kentucky being of full age and sound mind and memory, do make, publish, and declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all wills or no heretofore made.

FIRST: I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate, as soon as practicable after the time of my decease, and that my executors have erected at my grave a monument at a cost of not less than \$100.00, and that said executors procure a steel vault in which to inter my remains.

SECOND: All the property, real or personal, of every kind and description, where so ever or situate, which I may own or have the right to dispose of at the time of my decease, I direct the same to be sold by my executors hereinafter designated, and the proceeds to be given to the St. Reynolds church of Hardinsburg, Kentucky, to be in the name of and under the control of the present priest, the Rev. Father Rosengarten and his successors and to be used by them as is deemed best for and in the interest of the said church, this is given for the saying of 75 masses for the repose of the souls of mine & my family.

THIRD: I make, nominate and appoint the Farmers Bank & Trust Co. of Hardinsburg, Ky. to be the executors of this my last will and testament, with full power and authority, in order to carry into effect all the provisions and purpose of this will, to sell and dispose of all my real estate or personal, for such prices and upon such terms of credit and in such manner, as my said executors may deem best, and to execute and deliver to the purchasers all necessary or proper deeds and other instruments of conveyance and transfer thereof.
