

WILL OF JAMES R. MITCHELL.

August 10, 1927.

STATE OF KENTUCKY
BRECKENRIDGE COUNTY,

I James R. Mitchell of County and State aforesaid being of sound mind and well disposing memory hereby make and declare this my last will and testament revoking any instrument of writing I may have heretofore made.

1st, I will and bequeath to my beloved daughter Alma Mitchell Cunningham all my real estate whatsoever situated in the town of Meadeville, Ky., including homestead store house and such other properties as I may own and are mine in this town.

2nd I will to my Grandson Lamar Mitchell the sum of One Hundred dollars this sum to be held for him by Alma Mitchell Cunningham till he is twenty one years of age It is my request that the aforesaid require no bond of Alma Mitchell Cunningham for properly carrying out this clause 2 bequest.

3rd I bequeath to each of my children below named,

Grever Mitchell and Mattie Mitchell Yates the sum of One Hundred dollars.

4th I bequeath to each of my children Finley Mitchell Sr, Alma Mitchell Cunningham and Lena Mitchell Vessels the sum of Ten Dollars.

4th I bequeath to each of my Grandchildren Finley Mitchell Jr and Marry Catherine Mitchell the sum of five dollars.

Fifth I leave such other money as I may be possessed of at my death in charge of Alma Mitchell Cunningham to expend in having masses for my soul and the soul of my deceased wife Mattie J. Mitchell It is my request and last wish that my daughter Alma Mitchell Cunningham be appointed by the Courts & Judge as Executrix of my estate & that said court require no bond or inventory from her for carrying out conditions of this will.
