

WILL OF JESSE S. HENRY,

I, Jesse S. Henry, of Hardinsburg, County of Breckinridge and State of Kentucky, being of full age and sound mind and memory, do make, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament.

FIRST; I do first that all my Just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate as soon as practicable after the time of my decease.

SECOND; The house and lot where the Gentry family now lives, and which I purchased from the Daniel estate I Give, Bequeath and devise to my daughter, Alma B. Johnson, and her husband, Jesse Johnson, for their joint lives, as tenants in common, with remainder for life to survivor of them, with remainder in fee simple to the heirs of my body.

THIRD, I Give and Bequeath to Marylene Hamilton, daughter of John Hamilton, the small Book case and music port-folio, which will be found in my possession in house among my household effects.

FOURTH; I make, nominate and appoint my good friend, John Hamilton, of Harfield, Ky., to be the executor of this my last will and testament, and request that no bond be required of him as such. I further request that no inventory of my estate be made or taken in so far as the same may be lawfully omitted. And I hereby Give him full power, right and authority to sell any and all real estate not devised under this will and convey the same by deed to the purchaser.
