I, John H. Avitt of LodiBURG, Kentucky, declare this to be my last will and testament, revoking any and all other wills or testaments I may have made.

(1) I desire that all just debts which I may owe at my death, to be paid fully.

(2) I will and Bequeath to my wife Capitola Avitt, all of my personal property to her absolutely.

(5) I request my wife, Capitola Avitt to pay any debts which I may be owing at my death, out of the property willed and devised to her by this will,
