

WILL OF JOHN D. BABBAge.

I, John D. BabBAge, of Cloverport, Breckinridge County, Kentucky, being of full age and of sound mind and memory, do make publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all wills by me heretofore made.

ITEM 1. I hereby direct that all of my Just debts and funeral expenses be first paid out of my estate, as soon as practicable after the time of my decease.

ITEM 2. All of my property real and personal, of every kind and description, wherever situate, which I may own or have the right to dispose of at the time of my decease, I hereby Give, Bequeath and devise to my wife, Mollie A. BabBAge, absolutely and in fee simple.

ITEM 3. I hereby make, nominate and appoint my said wife, Mollie A. BabBAge, to be the executrix of this my last will and testament, and I direct that no Bond be required of her as such, I further request that no inventory of my estate be made or taken, in so far as the same may be lawfully omitted.
