

WILL OF JOHN M. ROLLINS.

COUNTY OF WRECKENRIDGE.

I, John M. Rollins, being of sound and disposing mind and memory and knowing the certainty of death, do make and declare this to be my last will and testament hereby revoking any and all other wills by me at any time heretofore made.

FIRST, I desire that all my funeral expenses and Just debts shall be paid.

SECOND, I desire that that all other property of which I may die possessed of any and all kinds whatsoever be left to my beloved wife Cornelia Rollins and I desire that she shall have absolute control of all property stocks and bonds of which I may die possessed, and I further desire that she shall be Given absolute control of said property to sell or convey in any manner she may choose, and I further desire that she shall be Granted the authority by the courts to sell and convey any real estate or property of any kind whatever of which I may die possessed.

THIRD, I desire that my wife Cornelia Rollins be appointed Executrix of my estate and request that the courts neither require bond of her nor an inventory of my estate
