

## IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN.

I Joanna Payne of Webster, in the County of Breckinridge Co., State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and memory and considering the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life, do therefore make, ordain, witness and declare this to be my last WILL AND TESTAMENT.

FIRST, I order and direct that my Executor hereinafter named pay all my just debts and funeral expenses as soon after my decease as conveniently may be.

SECOND, After the payment of such funeral expenses and debts, I give, devise and bequeath,

1ST. To my great niece, Mary Virginia Compton the sum of Five Hundred (\$500.00) dollars.

2ND. It is my wish that the remainder of my estate, both personal and real be equally divided between my brothers and sisters, namely Jack Mattingly, Bob Mattingly, Arthur Mattingly & June Mattingly and Mrs Nellie Speaks, Mrs Nettie Compton and Mrs Birtie Mattingly and in case of the death of any of them, their interest is to go to their children and to be divided equally between the children of the deceased. In event any of my brothers or sisters die without issue their interest in my estate is to be divided among my other brothers and sisters or their heirs.

LASTLY, I make, constitute and appoint to be Executor of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me made,

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal the 12th day of May , in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and thirty.

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I, Mrs Joanna Payne, of Webster, Breckinridge County, State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing memory, make, publish and declare this a codicil of my last Will and Testament, dated on the 12th day of May 1930.

ITEM 1. I hereby revoke and annul that part of item two of my said will which gives to my brother, June Mattingly, an equal division of my estate with my other brothers and sisters and he is not to receive anything under said will or this Codicil, because I have heretofore given and delivered to him his share of my estate, in real estate, and he shall receive nothing further.

ITEM 2; I hereby further change item two of my said Will in this, to wit, I desire that my sister Mrs Nellie Compton, with whom I now live, to further have and use my homestead, located in Webster, Breckinridge County, Kentucky, and all my household furnishings to be used by her during her natural life and at her death all the above mentioned real estate and personal property shall revert back to my estate, to be equally divided among the devisees, as provided in item two of my Will subject to the changes made therein by this Codicil.

In all other respects I re-affirm my original Will, except that I nominate J.D. Lyddan to be the Executor of my Will and this Codicil, and that he be required to execute such bond as the court may deem proper.
