

LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT

OF

J. W. ATER

I, J. W. Ater, of Irvington, Breckinridge County, Kentucky, Being of sound mind and memory, do make, publish and declare this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking any and all Wills By me heretofore made,

FIRST: I direct that all my Just debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon ~~after~~ ^{at} my decease as may be found convenient.

SECOND I Give, devise and Bequeath to my wife, Hattie Ater, the following household articles, to-wit: 1 rug, 1 rocking chair, 2 pillows, 8 quilts.

THIRD: I Give, devise and Bequeath to my Grand-daughter, Helen Ater, Four Hundred and seventy five (\$475.00) in cash, also, one dresser and one safe formerly the property of my first wife.

FOURTH: I Give, devise and Bequeath to my Grandson, J. W. Ater, my automobile and Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) in cash.

FIFTH I Give, devise and Bequeath to my daughter, Ida Belle Ashcraft, Twenty Five Dollars (\$25.00) in cash, and direct that my executor hereinafter named to pay said sum to her as her share of my estate as soon as practicable after the time of my decease.

SIXTH: I Give, devise and Bequeath to my son, Arthur Ater, the property known as the Carter property in fee simple with the right to dispose of the same as he may desire.

SEVENTH All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate, real, personal and mixed, of whatever nature, and wheresoever situate, which I may own or have the right to dispose of at the time of my decease, I Give, devise and Bequeath to my son, Arthur Ater, in fee simple with the right ^{to} ~~at~~ dispose of the same as he may desire.

EIGHTH: I direct that in case any of the parties mentioned in this my last will and Testament should test the validity of the same, in that event, he, she or they forfeit their right or rights to receive any of the benefits or Bequests under the same.

NINTH: I hereby make, nominate and appoint my son, Arthur Ater, my executor under this my last Will and Testament and direct that he be permitted to qualify as said executor without Bond.
