I, Lloyd Butler, a resident of Breckinridge County, Kentucky, and post office
address, Harned, Kentucky, in said county and state, being of full age, and of sound
mind and memory, do make, publish and declare this to be my last will
and testament, hereby, revoking all former wills made by me.

Item I. I direct that all my debts and funeral
expenses be paid out of my estate as soon as practicable after the time of my
decease.

Item II. I further desire and direct that all the balance of my property,
real, personal and mixed of every kind and description, wheresoever situated
which I may own, or have the right to dispose of at the time of my death, shall
shall go to my wife, Ethel Butler, during her natural life, and after the death
of my said wife, I will and direct that the home place on which I now live,
consisting of 1 1/2 acres of real estate and all of the personal property thereon
at the time of the decease of my wife, shall descend to Red Butler, Lee
