

Will

I, Margaret S. Bowmer of Cloonport, Breckinridge County of Ky, being of sound mind and disposing memory do hereby publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, revoking all other wills or Codicils thereto which I may heretofore made.

I direct that all of my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate as soon as may be practical after my death.

I give and bequeath to each grand child who may be living at the time of my death, the sum of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars.

I direct that all the residue of my estate real personal and mixed wherever situated, be divided into equal parts, and I give devise and bequeath unto each of my children, and to the bodily heirs of any child who may be dead, one of said equal parts, absolutely and in fee simple.

I hereby make nominate and appoint my son, William S. Bowmer, my executor and give to him full power and authority to sell and convey any and all of my real estate and to reinvest the proceeds thereof in other real estate or in good interest bearing securities, and to change from time to time any and all investments, and I hereby direct that no purchaser or purchasers from him shall be required to see or be responsible for the proper handling or reinvestment of the proceeds arising from such sale or sales.

I further direct that my said son, shall be permitted to qualify as executor without security of any kind, on his bond, and that no inventory be taken or appraisement made of my estate insofar as the same may be lawfully omitted, and that my said son be paid a reasonable allowance for his services as executor.

I also give and bequeath the sum of a thousand dollars to the fund for Superannuated Methodist Preachers.
