

Will.

I, Margaret Corae, of M^cQuady, County of
Buckneridge and State of Kentucky, being of
full age and of sound mind and memory,
do make, publish and declare this to be
my last will and testament, hereby revoking
all wills by me heretofore made.

First: I direct that all my just debts and
funeral expenses be paid out of my estate
as soon as practicable after the time
of my decease.

Second: Should my husband, Amos Wheeler,
survive me, I will and devise that \$200⁰⁰
be placed in the Farmers Bank & Trust Company
of Hardinsburg, Kentucky, in trust and
to be held in trust until his death, the
same to be used to pay his funeral
expenses. I further will and devise
all my real estate to him during
his natural life, or so long as he
remains unmarried, and at his
death or re-marriage, all the real
estate shall revert to my Children.

Third: All the remainder of my property,
real and personal, of every kind and
description whereever situated, which
I may own or have the right to
dispose of at the time of my decease
I give and bequeath absolutely in
fee simple to my Children and their
heirs, should any be dead, share and
share alike; except that my two
grandsons, Hurray Jolly and Harry Jolly,
Children of my deceased daughter, Elsie
Jolly, shall only take their mother's
part in any sum of money which
may be paid by the Government
to my estate, after my death, as life
insurance money on the life of
Silas M^c Gary.

Fourth: I hereby appoint and nominate
J. C. Hendrick of Hardinsburg, Kentucky to
be the executor of this my last will

and testament.
