ITEM 1. I direct that all of my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate as soon as may be practicable after the time of my decease.

ITEM 2. I give, devise, and bequeath unto my sons, Nevious Marion Behen, Lafe Johnson Behen and Ira D. Behen, all of my property of which I may die possessed, real personal, and mixed, wheresoever situated, absolutely and in fee simple, each to receive one-third.

ITEM 3. I make, nominate and appoint my three sons, Nevious Marion Behen, Lafe Johnson Behen, and Ira DeHaven Behen, to be the executors of this, my last will and testament, and I request that they be permitted to execute bond without surety of any kind thereon, and I request that no Inventory be taken or appraisement made of my estate in so far as the same may be lawfully omitted.
