

Examined.

I Marion Hamilton of Clatsop Breckenridge County Kentucky being of sound mind and disposing memory do make and declare and publish this instrument as and for my last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all others

1 I give and devise to my beloved wife Nellie Hamilton my house and lot in Clatsop Kentucky, now occupied by one as my dwelling, to be used or disposed of by her as she may desire

2 My household effects of every description whatever I own and bequeath to my said wife

3 My undivided half interest in the storehouse property of Bowmer & Hamilton inclusive of the warehouse adjoining it I desire to be treated as follows viz: My said wife is to have and enjoy the income or rental of the same so long as she lives but should it become necessary to sell my interest in the same, or it shall be deemed advantageous to sell the same, I direct it shall be sold, and the proceeds arising from the sale be invested by my Executor in good safe interest bearing securities, and she shall be entitled to and have the interest thereof so long as she shall live

4 I give and bequeath to my said wife two certain short line (Louisville & Frankfort and Lexington and Frankfort Railroad) 7% Bonds of \$1000 each; also three certain I.M. & J.R.R. 7% Bonds of \$1000 each; also one City of Louisville 6% Bond of \$1000; also one Henderson Railroad Bridge Bond 7% for \$1000 in all sum Thousand Dollars which I now have on hand. That is to say she is to enjoy and have the income from the said specified Bonds during her life. My Executor shall hold the same in trust for her and pay over to her the interest as it accrues. Whenever it shall become necessary to reinvest the same My Executor shall do so and she shall continue to enjoy the interest as above directed and principal after her death shall go as hereafter directed

5 I hereby add to the above Bonds and to be held for my said wife benefit in the manner above directed. One other bond for \$1000 Kentucky and Indiana Bridge Bond 5% the principal likewise to go after her death in the manner hereafter directed

6 I give and bequeath to my nephew whom I have raised Jefferson D Hamilton my undivided half of the stock of goods and merchandise which may be purchased and on hand of all and every nature whatever, at the time of my death together with all fixtures and appliances pertaining thereto and used in the conduct of the mercantile business of Bowmer & Hamilton to be his absolutely; also all the assets money, notes, accounts choses in action belonging to me in and of the said

partnership of Bowmer & Hamilton. I desire him to take my place and interest in said partnership and firm and to own all my interest as above set out and to assume all my liabilities for and on account of the business and affairs of said partnership, and none of my liabilities by reason of same to accrue or be chargeable to my estate.

7 At the death of my wife, I desire my said nephew Jefferson D Hamilton to take and have the sum of Five Thousand Dollars of the bonds or their proceeds herein above set apart to my wife

8 I have \$2500 of other bonds in addition to those above described and set apart for my wife benefit

I give and bequeath to my brother Alexander Hamilton one Louisville City 4% Bond of \$1000

I give and bequeath to my sister Mary E Hamilton one Louisville City Bond of \$1000

I give and bequeath to my niece Ruth Hargland one Kentucky and Indiana Bridge Bond 5% for \$500

9 I also devise to my said niece Ruth Hargland my house and lot on second street adjoining John S. Harkness property in Clatsop Ky.

10 I give and devise to my brother Edwin Hamilton my land known as the Cooper land of about 245 acres in Breckenridge County

11 I desire my Executor out of any remaining funds of my estate to pay to Marion Bowmer, Marion Babbage, Marion Hamilton and Marion Montgomery (of Arkansas) four little girls orphans of mine the sum of one hundred Dollars each

12 I desire my personal debts (not the partnership liabilities above mentioned) to be paid out of the residue of my estate; also funeral charges, cemetery lot monument and the like

13 I direct my Executor to pay to the Clatsop Baptist Church for use of the Sunday School, the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars to be expended in such manner as is deemed by the Church most useful to the children who are taught in said School

14 All the residue of my estate whatever there may be after administering as above directed and paying charges of administration and contingent expenditures out of same I desire to be divided equally between my said wife and my said nephew Jefferson D Hamilton

15 In case the store house property shall be sold as provided for by 3 of this will the joint signatures of my said

wife and of my Executor to a Deed of Conveyance shall make complete title to any purchaser.

16 I hereby constitute and appoint my tried and trusted friend William N. Bowmer my Executor to carry into effect the provisions of this will and hereby request that no bond be required of him by any Court.
