I give and devise to my six children by my first wife the one thousand dollars (\$1000⁰⁰) Insurance in the Mutual Life of New York City of which each is to receive One hundred and sixty six Dollars and thirty three cents this money to be paid them as soon as received by the Executor of this Will from said Lodge.
5. In event of the death of each, or any of the six children, ^{of the first wife} the amount is to be Equally divided among the remaining living

1. In event of the death of the married daughter mentioned this share is to fall to this house

2. I give & devise to all my children by my second wife the one thousand dollars (\$1000⁰⁰) Insurance in the Mutual Life of New York City of which each is to receive One hundred and sixty six Dollars and thirty three cents this money to be paid them as soon as received by the Executor of this Will from said Lodge.

3. I give & devise to my children by my second wife the one thousand dollars (\$1000⁰⁰) Insurance in the Mutual Life of New York City of which each is to receive One hundred and sixty six Dollars and thirty three cents this money to be paid them as soon as received by the Executor of this Will from said Lodge.

4. I should the former and business and the widow not agree the Executors in any way may be at liberty to wind up the affair and divide the assets as herein stated this is my last will and testament, and each and every one that I have heretofore made shall be null & void.
