

Will of Mary C. Henry
 I, Mary C. Henry, of Hardinsburg, County
 of Buchanan, and State of Kentucky, being of full
 age and of sound mind and memory, do make,
 publish and declare this to be my last will and
 testament.

First, I direct that all my just debts
 and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate
 as soon as practicable after the time of my decease.

Second: I give, devise and bequeath my
 piano to my niece, Majorie Wilson, daughter of
 John Wesley Wilson, of 4535 Cottage Ave., St. Louis
 Mo.

Third: I give, devise and bequeath to my
 executor hereinafter named, in trust, the proceeds
 of the life policy in the Standard Life Ins. of Atlanta,
 Ga. for the purpose of buying a tombstone for my
 grave, and after paying for the tombstone, the
 remainder to be held in trust and the interest to
 be used for the upkeep of the grave lot in the Paris
 Cemetery, at Paris, Kentucky.

Should the executor decline to accept said
 trust then the court to appoint some suitable
 person who will accept and execute the trust
 as herein directed.

Fourth: I give and devise to my husband,
 Rev. Jesse S. Henry, during his natural life, or so
 long as he remains my widower, my house and
 lot in Hardinsburg, Kentucky on Second Street,
 which we now occupy as a home; my interest in
 bank stock in First Standard Bank of Louisville,
 Kentucky, my life insurance of \$1000.00 in the Metro-
 politan Ins. Co., all household and kitchen furniture.
 After the death of said husband, Jesse S. Henry, or
 in the event of his re-marriage, I give and devise said
 property herein set out in this section to my nieces
 namely, Julia Spears, Helen Spears, Pauline Spears and
 Martha Spears, daughters of Lettie Spears of 1420 Main
 St., Covington, Kentucky, and my niece, Victoria
 Courtney of 1408 Liberty Ave., Flint, Mich., and my
 Majorie Wilson of 4535 Cottage Ave., St. Louis, Mo., and
 my niece, Virginia Soff, Amsterdam, N.Y. I direct
 that said property be sold and the proceeds be di-

vided equally among my seven above named nieces.

Fifth: All remaining property, real and personal, of every kind and description, wheresoever situate, which I may own or have the right to dispose of at the time of my decease, I give, bequeath and devise to my husband, Jesse S. Henry, absolutely and in fee simple.

I make, nominate and appoint, my husband, Jesse S. Henry to be the Executor of this my last will and testament, Dated at Hardinsburg, Ky., this 23rd., day of June 1926.
