Smart the other attesting witness thereto, and they signed said instrument as witnesses in his presence and in the presence of each other, wherefore it is adjudged as and for the last will and testament of the said Silas Lillard, deceased, and as such was ordered to record, whereupon the same with the foregoing and this certificate have been duly recorded in my office.

I, Mary L. Roberts, of the County of Breckinridge and state of Kentucky, being of full age and sound of mind and memory, do make, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all wills by me heretofore made.

ITEM 1. I direct that all of my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate as soon as practicable after the time of my decease.

ITEM 2. Whereas, I own certain lots with warehouse thereon in the town of Stephensport, Breckinridge County, Ky., I hereby devise and bequeath said tobacco warehouse and lots to my brother-in-law, Andrew Crawford, for and during his natural life, he is to keep the taxes paid thereon and to receive and enjoy the rents and profits therefrom, but at his death the said warehouse and lots to pass to and become the absolute property, in fee simple, of Pauline Moorman Dowell, my niece, with whom I now reside; and whereas, I own a certain house and lot known as the Hiner house and another house and lot purchased from Henry Jones, in the town of Stephensport, Breckinridge County, Kentucky, I now devise and bequeath said two pieces of real estate to my sister Alice Crawford, for and during her life time, that she may hold and enjoy the rents and profits from same, but at her death the said two pieces of real estate shall pass to and become the absolute property, in fee simple, of my niece, Pauline Moorman Dowell, aforesaid; but the said devisees under this my will shall both pay the taxes due on said property so long as they use it, and same shall be kept in as good repair as it is at the time of my death.

ITEM 3. All the property, real and personal, of every kind and description, wheresoever situated, which I may own or have the right to dispose of at the time of my decease, I give and bequeath and devise to me niece, Pauline Moorman Dowell, absolutely and in fee simple.

ITEM 4. I make, nominate and appoint The Bank of Hardinsburg & Trust Co., of Hardinsburg, Breckinridge County, Ky., to be the executor of this my last will and testament. I further request that no inventory of my estate be made or taken in so far as the same may be lawfully omitted.
