I, MARY F. Dewel wife of F. P. Dewell, Hardinsburg, Breckenridge County, Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposal memory and wishing to make a different disposition of my property to that the law would make, make the following will.

I, Sibe and devise my entire household Goods to my son Franklin, all of the said Goods to be his own use and dispossal and he (Franklin) must else let my husband, his father have a part of same or which things they may both agree about and whatever his father may Get when he is through with it he shall turn to our son Franklin and all these things must be left in my husbands charge and control to him take care of until Franklin may marry or Gees to keeping house and if the other children want some part of the things they must buy and pay for them and the money kept for Franklins use when the Goods are turned over to him when he needs same,

Now my reason for giving my stuff to Franklin is, the rest of the children have gotten their share and are in position to get along fairly well and Franklin has never had anything given him and is left with nothing and no one to help him, so far that reason I will him balance of my stuff.
