Item 1. I direct that all of my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate as soon as practicable after the time of my decease.

Item 2. To my grandson, Eliza A. Richardson, I will the sum of ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.00), and no more.

Item 3. All the balance of my estate, real personal and mixed, of every kind, nature and description, I will to my children-R. C. Richardson, Sarah E. Richardson, Cora Richardson Beard, Lena Richardson Milner, and Mary Richardson Schreiber, my afore named five children to share and share alike.

Item 4. Having full confidence in the executive ability and fairness of dealing of my son, R. C. Richardson, I hereby nominate and appoint said R. C. Richardson executor of this my last will and testament, with full power to compromise, settle and adjust all debts and claims which may be presented against my estate, or which may be due my estate, and if necessary to sell, at private or public sale at such prices, and upon such terms of credit as he may deem best, the whole or any part of my real estate or personal property, and to execute, acknowledge and deliver deeds and other proper instruments of conveyance thereof to the purchaser or purchasers.
