

Hardinsburg, Ky., October 21-1913.

I, Morris H. Beard, of Hardinsburg, Kentucky, do declare this instrument to be my last Will and Testament.

1. All my just debts which I may owe shall first be paid in full out of my estate.

11. I hereby will devise and bequeath all of my property, real, personal and mixed to The Bank of Hardinsburg & Trust Company, in trust for my wife and boys as hereinafter provided.

I will and devise, for the period of her natural life, to my wife Sallie M. Beard, one half of the net income of my said estate to be paid to her by said trustee in such installments as she may desire. Upon her death then said one half of said estate shall descend to my two sons equally, B. F. Beard, Jr. and Murray Beard, but they shall not into the possession of said part of said estate until the time as is provided herein for them to come into possession of the other one-half of said estate which is willed to them jointly as follows:

One-half of my entire estate shall be held in trust for said B. F. Beard, Jr., and said Murray Beard jointly and the income thereof shall be paid to them by said trustee jointly till they are 25 years of age or to their guardian, or guardians, but upon the arrival of each of said children at the age of 25 years then his joint part of said estate shall become his property in fee simple and said Trustee shall thereupon turn same over to him.

111. I desire that the farming business of Robertson-Beard Co. shall be conducted as now conducted until such time as said C. V. Robertson and my Trustee shall determine would be an opportune time to dispose of its holdings, which I desire shall be done as quickly as said time may present itself.

1V. I hereby cloth with full power and authority my said Trustee with the right to sell and convey by deed of conveyance any part of the real estate belonging to said estate, whenever, in its judgment, such can be done beneficially to the estate but I request trustee to consult my wife as to real estate transfers before same are made, and, further, said Trustee shall have the full right to change the identity of any of the property, real or personal, belonging thereto at any time such can be done to the benefit of said estate. The full charge, control and management of said estate is invested in said Trustee for the purpose indicated herein.

I further request said Trustee, at any time, she may desire, to permit my said wife together with any legal advisor she may choose, have a full and complete inventory of said estate.

V. I hereby nominate The Bank of Hardinsburg & Trust Company to be Executor of this my last will and request the County Court, upon probation of this will to so name said Company as such Executor.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto signed my name to this will and acknowledge it to be my will in every particular, in the presence of Claude Mercer and J. R. Layman, and said two witnesses have hereunto signed their names as such in my presence.
