I, Col Elliot of the County of Breckinridge State of Kentucky being sound in mind and disposing memory knowing the certainty of death and uncertainty of life and being desirous of making a will different from that which would be made by law should I die intestate declare this to be my last will and testament first it is my will and desire that upon my death that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid and a cheap double monument be placed at my and my wife's grave, Second it is my will and desire that my daughter Dicie Whitworth shall have One Hundred Dollars and my Grand son Harvey R. Whitworth One hundred Dollars, Third it is my will and desire that my son Roy Elliot shall be appointed Administrator of my will with out bond after paying all debts and one hundred dollars exact to Dicie Whitworth and Harvey R. Whitworth, One hundred dollars the remainder shall be divided EQUALLY with my two sons ~~ROY WHITWORTH and HARVEY WHITWORTH~~ Roy Elliot and Percy Elliot consisting of house hold and Kitchen furniture horses cattle farming tools and all of my personal property in testimony whereof witness my hand this 5 day of Dec 1929.
