

## WILL OF Richard Wilson,

I, Richard Wilson of Harned, Ky., being of sound mind and disposing memory do hereby make this my last will and testament hereby revoking all wills heretofore made.

## ITEM 1.

I bequeath to my beloved wife Nannie D. Wilson all of estate real and personal to be hers absolutely and to be under her sole control so long as she may live. If it becomes necessary to sell any of my property either real or personal for the present support of my wife the said Nannie D. Wilson, or to pay any of my just debts I hereby authorize and empower her to sell same and make a deed of conveyance.

## ITEM 2.

I will and decree that after my death all my just debts and funeral expenses shall be paid, as expeditiously as possible after my death.

## ITEM 3.

After my wife's death I will and devise that all my property that may be left, both real and personal shall be equally divided into equal parts and shall go as follows,

One sixth to be divided equally among the children of Granville Wilson who was my elder son and who is dead.

One-sixth to Hes Wilson my son

One-sixth to Hardin Wilson my son,

One-sixth to Mrs Marvin Bruington my daughter,

One-sixth to Paymend Wilson my son,

One-sixth to Hubert Wilson, my son.

## ITEM 4.

I hereby appoint my wife Nannie D. Wilson Executrix of my estate and request that she be permitted to qualify without bond, and that no inventory of my estate be made except insofar as the law may require.

## ITEM 5.

As heretofore stated I empower my said wife and Executrix with full authority to sell and convey any of my estate as set forth in Item 1.
