In the Name of our Merciful Father:
Be it known that I, R. L. Newson, of the City
of Cloverport, County of Breckinridge, and
State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and
deposing memory, and knowing the uncer-
tainty of life and the certainty of death, do
make and ordain this as my last will and
Testament, hereby revoking any will by me
heretofore made, that I do give,
devise, bequeath and dispose of my estate,
real, personal and mixed in the manner
and proportion here following:

To My Beloved wife Jennie S Newsom, who has been a faithful, indulgent, competent and Considerate Companion to me, and who at all times been willing to deny herself for my sake, therefore should she survive me, it is my will she have, use, and enjoy during her life all my estate of every description Real, Personal and Mixed, and all Moneys derived Therefrom in rents profits, Collections, and otherwise, and, at any time after paying my just debts and funeral expenses should the remainder of my said estate be insufficient to produce an income adequately sufficient for her liberal support she is hereby authorized and empowered to sell such of said estate as may be necessary to supply her wants;

I hereby constitute and appoint my wife Jennie S Newsom Executrix of this my will and no bond shall be required of her, and I venture to suggest that she, and any attorney or Coassistant she may employ, use proper discrimination touching the allowance of all doubtful claims asserted against said estate. I further desire that after the death of the said Jennie S. Newsom, what remains of said estate shall be divided among my Children in the manner and proportion following
To my eldest son W. W. Newsom Five Twentieths
To my eldest daughter Luella Boyd Seven Twentieths
To my second son A. L. Newsom Two Twentieths
To my third son P. L. Newsom Four Twentieths
To my second daughter Irene Loring Two Twentieths
The reason of this discrimination will be obvious to the minds of my Children as between W. W. Newsom and Luella Boyd the former has already received largely more than the latter,

as between A. L. Newsom and P. L. Newsom the former drew the latter into trouble which caused me much distress. As to my daughter Irene Loring I refer her to two very disrespectful letters concerning me

relative to my second marriage, one written to her brother W. W. Newsom, and one to his sister Luella Boyd.

and now be it further known that W. W. Newsom having qualified at Sherman Texas as guardian of his son Harry E Newsom, and if by reason of misappropriation or loss of any part of said wards estate, the said loss (if any) if not made good by the sureties on said Guardians bond then the five-twentieths of my estate set apart to W. W. Newsom or sufficient thereof to make good said loss (if any) except one dollar, is to accrue to the benefit of the said Harry E Newsom.
