8. The balance of my property I wish sold and the proceeds with what cash after paying all cash bequests I may have on hand at my death, to be equally divided between my heirs, Taylor Scott, Mary T. Payne, Addie Brown Margaret J. Scott, Herace Scott, Charles Scott and Arthur Scott.

I appoint my step son, John L. Morris my executor of this my will with full power and authority to carry out its provisions, No bond shall be required of him and a receipt from him the heirs shall be a full acquaintance to him.
