Priest, of Breckenridge County Kentucky, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking any and all other wills that may have heretofore been made by me, It is my will that as soon as after my death as possible that all of my Estate be sold both personal and real at private or public sale as my Executor hereinafter named may think the most advantageous, that after my Estate is sold and collected into money with such cash as I may have on hands at the time of my death; that out of this fund arising from the marshaling of my Estate into cash, that my Executor pay all of my debts, then after this is done I direct my Executor to pay to Miss Ella Priest, my niece, the sum of EIGHT HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$800.00) I Requite and devise the aforesaid sum to my niece Ella Priest because of the fact that she has assisted me in the raising of my children, after this is done then I direct that the remainder of said fund whatever it may be, be divided into seven Equal parts and distributed as follows;

One seventh to my daughter Mamie Algood,

One seventh to my daughter Della Horalby,

One seventh to my son William H. Priest,

One seventh to my son Sanford M. Priest,

One seventh to my son Payton A. Priest

One seventh to my son A. A. Priest

One seventh to be divided Equally Between my Grand children, Bessie Priest and Katie Priest, the children of my deceased son, Sherman Priest.

I hereby appoint the Bank of Hardinsburg & Trust Company as my Executor with full power to carry out the intentions of this will, and with full power to transfer by deed any or all of my property.
