

WILL OF THOMAS G. ESKRIDGE.

Hardinsburg, Ky., Sept 19, 1929.

I, Thomas G. Eskridge of Hardinsburg, Kentucky, being of sound mind and memory do hereby make this my last will and testament.

I direct first that my debts be paid.

I bequeath to my brother, Jesse R. Eskridge one dollar.

I Give, devise and bequeath to my sisters who may survive me in equal shares all of the remainder of my estate of whatever kind, real, personal, and mixed, of which I shall die seized and possessed, or to which I may at my decease be in any way entitled, to have and to hold the same to their heirs and assigns forever.

I appoint my sister, Clara Eskridge, to be the sole executrix of my estate without bond.

In witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal and publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, dated September 19, 1929.
