

Know all Men by These presents, That I, Thomas P. Hardaway, of near Bewleyville, Breckenridge County, State of Kentucky, being of sound Mind and disposing memory, do make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all other wills heretofore made by me.

I Want all of my Just Debts paid in full and my property and estate stands so charged. I have heretofore given and advanced to my sons Ernest E. Hardaway, A. Moremen Hardaway and W. Glenn Hardaway, and to my Daughter Harriett Bell Drury, and to each of them, their full share and interest in my estate and property, and no one of them shall have any interest in or receive any part, or any thing from my property or estate of any kind, which I may own at the time of my death. Subject to and charged with the payment of the five specific devices hereinarter made. I hereby devise and bequeath to my son Eugene Pierce Hardaway absolutely and in fee simple and to him and his heirs and assigns forever, all of the property, both real, personal and mixed, and of every kind and description and where-ever situated and located, and owned by me at the time of my death, subject to and charged with the payment of Ten Dollars to my son Charles D. Hardaway and which sum is hereby devised to him and subject to and charged with the payment of Ten Dollars to my Daughter, Mrs Delia Moremen, and which sum is hereby devised to her, and subject to and charged with the payment of the sum of Two Hundred dollars to my son Thomas Hunter Hardaway and which sum of \$ 200.00 hereby devised and bequeathed to him and subject to and charged with the payment of a sum of Two Hundred Dollars to my son B. Logan Hardaway, and which sum of \$ 200.00 is hereby devised and bequeathed to him, and subject to and charged with the payment of the sum of Two Hundred dollars to my daughter Mrs Emma Peyton, and which sum of \$ 200.00 is hereby devised and bequeathed to her.

The foregoing Five specific devises shall be a charge and lien on all the personal property and estate which I own at the time of my death.

My son Eugene Pierce Hardaway shall have and is hereby given the right and privilege of paying the foregoing Five specific devises, together with any debts, I may owe at my death and my funeral expenses, and then taking receiving and holding my entire estate and all of my property of every kind and description, without appraisement or administration, and free from the Claims of any and all persons.

I hereby appoint my son Eugene Pierce Hardaway, Executor of this my last Will and request that he be allowed to qualify and act as such without giving Bond or security.
