

I, W. D. Pumphrey of Brockbridge County and State of Kentucky, believing myself to be of sound mind and knowing the uncertainty of life, and being moved by advancing years, do make certain and establish this my last will hereby making all other I may have made,

Item 1st I give to my wife Mary D. Pumphrey all my estate of whatever kind it may be during her life of her paying my just bills

Item 2, To my son Roke L. Charles the W. D. Pumphrey Jr and Clarence D. I have given their portions of my estate in land.

Item 3rd To my daughter Emma Tucker I have given her portion in money.

Item 4th There are no other children, Mr. Ulma Cannon, and Merwin L. who have not been provided for and I desire that Ulma Cannon shall have her 43. some of land, as her portion of my estate.

Item 5. There should be forgiving to Ulma 43 some about 86 some of which me to have been for Emma Tucker and Merwin L. But as I give to Emma her part in money, I now desire that the 43 some intended for her shall be given to Merwin L. and the 43. some of that which me his own, making 86 some I give him.

Item 6. I now desire that Merwin L. giving Merwin the 86 some of land, I also give him the balance of my estate of whatever it may consist of, both real or personal.

Item 7. This I give him in satisfaction of his taking care of me in exchange.

Item 8. I desire that there shall be no opposition of my estate, and that Merwin shall be my Executor to carry into effect this my will, & he shall not be required to give Bond.

Fourth: I hereby constitute and appoint my wife Caroline Douglas as Executor of this my last will and testament, and as such she will sell my property as may seem to her, I request that no security be required of her upon her bond.
