

I, W.H. Shively, being now of sound mind and disposing memory do now make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and annulling any and all former wills I may have heretofore at any time made; I give and bequeath to my Son Dr. George E. Shively all my property of which I may die possessed, and in which I may have any interest, including real estate, personal Property, including money on hand or in any bank on common deposit or special and time deposits; To include any property of every character wherever located that I may own or in which I may have any interest at my death, so as to vest in said Dr. George E. Shively, who now resides at Stephensport, Ky full title management, use and control, and hereby direct that he shall have immediate possession and control of all such property I may have or in which I have any interest to use occupy manage hold with fee simple title, to use as he may wish, sell transfer and convey title thereto as he may desire.

In the event of said Dr. George Shively's death before I die, then in that event all of said property shall descend to and become the property of his daughter Henrietta Shively, and also further in the event of his death, all of such property then remaining shall descend to said Henrietta Shively, to do with as she may desire;

I make this will and last testament because he has, care for me and I have lived with him since the death of my wife, his Mother, and I make this property to him in justice to him, and I hereby distinctly revoke and annul any and all former wills I may have ever made.
