

WILL OF WILSON DAVIS;

I, Wilson Davis, of Harned, Breckenridge County, State of Kentucky, being of full age and sound memory, do make, publish, and declare this to be my last Will and testament, hereby revoking all Wills by me heretofore made.

Item 1. I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate, as soon as practicable after the time of my decease.

ITEM 2. I give, devise and bequeath to Elmer Davis, my son by my first wife, who has not been with me since he was eight years old, as a evidence of my love and affection, the sum of one (\$1.00) dollar.

Item 3. I give, devise and bequeath to Jennie Reeney, my sister, as an evidence of my love and affection, the sum of one (\$1.00) dollars.

Item 4. To Pearl Davis, my beloved wife, who has constantly and tenderly cared for me in my last affliction and who has made an affectionate and dutiful wife, I give, devise and bequeath all the rest, residue and remainder of my property, both real and personal, of every kind and description, wheresoever situate, which I may own or have the right to dispose of, at the time of my decease, absolutely and in fee simple, I further give to my beloved wife, Pearl Davis, all of my rights, titles and interest in everything else forever.

Item 5. It is my request that after my decease my remains be buried in the new Cemetery at Hardinsburg, Kentucky.

ITEM 6. I make, nominate and appoint my wife, Pearl Davis, to be the executrix of this, my last Will and testament, and I request that no bond be required of her as such, I further request that no inventory of my estate be made or taken, insofar as the same may be lawfully committed.
