

Last Will of William J. Glascock

I, the undersigned, William J. Glascock, at this time a resident of Bessey Township, Harrison County, Indiana, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, in the name of the Benevolent Father of all, do make publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me made.

Item One---

I, direct that all my Just debts be paid by my executors herein after appointed, that my body be buried at the Methodist Church Cemetery at Mechanics, Breckenridge County, Kentucky, and that a suitable monument be placed at my grave.

Item Two---

I, give, will and bequeath unto my beloved children, Perry F. Glascock, Viola Spencer and Edward E. Glascock the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) each.

Item Three---

I, give, will and bequeath all the residue and remainder of my property of every kind and character whatsoever, share and share alike in equal parts to the remainder of my children and to the heirs of such as are dead, the children of such as are dead taking the part their parent would have received if living as follows; to James H. Glascock, one tenth, to the children of Francis R. Glascock deceased, one tenth; to John W. Glascock, one tenth, to the children of Nellie A. Armes deceased, one tenth to Logan Glascock, one tenth to Minnie Armes; one tenth to Sylvester Glascock, one tenth, to Cleore C. Glascock, one tenth to Ella May Cannon, one tenth and to the children of Josephine Milan, deceased, one tenth, all to be theirs absolutely.

Item Four.

I hereby constitute and appoint my said sons, James H. Glascock and Sylvester Glascock executors of this Will.
