Being of lawful age and sound mind I desire to make this my last will and testament to be as follows:

In case either of my children should die before my estate is divided that their part be paid equally to their children.

Fifth: I designate and name George Gray as my administrator and request that he give some bonding company as surety and that the cost of same be paid out of the estate.
