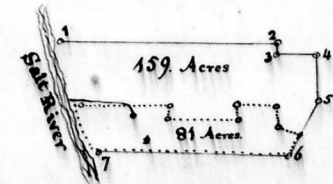
On the motion of Margaret Pope widow and rel^d of

We the undersigned, three of the Commissioners appointed to allot to
Margaret Pope widow of Benjamin Pope dec^d her dower in the Land and
slaves of said deceased, proceeded on the 7th & 8th days of November 1834 to
make said allotment of dower as follows - By survey, we ascertained the
whole tract of land contained 240 Acres and is bounded according to the
Survey and report of Whittledge Conall surveyor of Bullitt County and one
of our body - which survey is here attached as a part of our report - The
plot on this report sheet from figures 1 to 7 and the river from 1 to 7 show
the whole survey - The dotted lines on the west and lower sides of this tract
show the 81 Acres allotted to Wth Pope for her dower therein - which is one
equal third part of the whole tract with reference to quantity & quality
clears and wood land as near as we could arise at the time we were
