

In the name of god amen. I David Hall of the County of
Buttles & Commonwealth of Kentucky, being in a debilitated state
of health but in my right senses have a desire and do dis-
pose of all the property which I am possessed of in the
following manner To wit. In primis I do give to my
beloved wife Rachel one Grey Mare and saddle and the
bed on which I now am lying also the house & orchard
and the small piece of ground that I have hitherto
cultivated about the house, and to be left with her
to take what of the household furniture that she may
deem necessary for her own use. Likewise the fields
which I call my fields during her life and at her
death to fall into the estate to be equally divided
among my four after named daughters. the lands
excepted — To wit. I give and bequeath unto my two
sons William & Aaron Hall all the land which I hold
as mine to be divided in the following manner. Begin-
ning at Mr. Stingers line and run a straight line to the
dividing line which now separates the fields of my son
William and the field now cultivated by my son Aaron
then with said line in a straight line to my spring run
then down said run to Mr. Bullocks run. My said
son William to have the claybottom whereon he now
lives. My son Aaron to have the claybottom whereon he
now lives — To wit. I give and bequeath to my daughter
Mary being two hundred dollars including what I have
hitherto given her a memorandum of which may
be seen in a small book where mention is made of
what I ever have given her.

To wit. I do give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary
Porter two hundred dollars including what she has
had which may be seen aforesaid.

To wit. I do give and bequeath unto my daughter
Barbara Gentry the sum of two hundred dollars with
what I have hitherto given her which may be found
as above mentioned.

To wit. I do give and bequeath unto my daughter
Sarah Lewis two hundred dollars including what I have hitherto
given her which may be found as above mentioned.

To wit. I give and bequeath to my grand son Aaron
Porter one cow and half which I now milk.

To wit. Now it after the foregoing bequests are made
there should still remain property to any amount

whatever. I wish it to be equally divided between my four
above mentioned daughters.

To wit. I do hereby nominate and appoint Alexander King, who
has Gentry and Richard Leland executors of this my last Will and
testament and it is my wish that they shall execute said Will to
Clifton and Lincoln Hall, Lincoln Davis, Thomas Hall Jr. & John
Wharf. I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal
this 9th day of April in the year of our Lord 1814
