

In the name of god Amen I Josiah Evans of Bullitt County being of sound mind memory thanks to god calling into mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and declare this my last will and testament that is to say I give & recommend my soul into the hands of god that gave it & my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the almighty power of god. and as touching such worldly estate as it pleased god to bless me in this life I give and dispose of the same in the following manner and form - First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Ann my plantation and all my stock of every kind with all my household furniture bed & bedding so long as she remains a widow. and after the death of my wife Ann I will that my plantation shall be equally divided between my sons Isaac David Hopkins and the remainder part of my estate is at the disposal of my wife Ann. I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 29th day of January 1814 in presence of us.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Betty Davis all my real estate during her natural life and at her decease to be my son Pleasant Davis forever. I also give unto my beloved wife as much of my personal estate as she shall deem necessary for her comfortable support during her life. I give and bequeath also to Betty Holsclaw the bed and furniture wherewith she formerly abode my love to be hers after the decease of my wife. I give and bequeath unto my two sons John & David Davis all my personal estate after the decease of my wife to be equally divided between them of what shall remain until her death. I also give and bequeath unto Eviston Harris the bed he lies on and its furniture to be equal to what I give to Betty Holsclaw. I hereby appoint & declare, Pleasant County Secretary of this my last will and testament in Maysburg whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 13th day of April 1814
