 Bullitt that I shall hereinafter describe he goes bond for also about
 fifteen acres that adjoins the same and the south side being what
 I marked off to my son Lewis supposed to be fifteen acres also
 one Negro Boy named Jack. I give to my son Dennis Burall
 and bequeath to my son Dennis Burall all the balance of my
 land that lies in Nelson County except the fifteen acres that
 I left my son Lewis also after my wife Polly Burall death the Negro
 called Big. I give I bequeath to my daughter Nancy a
