my last Will and Testament in manner and form following That to-wit

I Give and bequeath to my wife Mary Stone my tract of land
on which I now live containing at least one hundred and twenty acres,
also all my negroes and the increase of them, so long as she remains my
widow, also all my stock farming utensils, household and kitchen
furniture or so much thereof as she shall deem necessary for the
support and the benefit of the family the balance of said property
My stock farming utensils, household &c of which the family shall
not stand in need of it is my Will and desire be sold on a credit of
twelve months the money when due to be put out at interest and
the interest thereon coming to be appropriated to the benefit of the
family as my wife may require. If my Widow should change her
Mind and by marrying it is my Will and desire that she be entitled
to a third part of my estate and the balance equally divided among
my children. It is also my will & desire that when my children or other
of them shall arrive at the age of twenty one years or shall marry
they shall be entitled to their proportionate share of the estate then
existing & appoint my wife Mary Stone executrix of this my last will
and Testament & hereby annul all & every Will heretofore made and
Testament for Testamentary where of I have set my hand and affixed

but if he should not live to that age at my wife's death my
will is that my son John Coyle and Pally inherit said part of my
Estate Equally divided between them if not inherited by my son James
I give to my son John I will & bequeath my old plantation adjoining
Blackson Entry and Thomas Stinger by him freely and fully possessed
Except Two hundred dollars that he must pay my daughter Pally
out of its value all the debts due me in this State I leave to be
equally divided between my two children John and Pally
The debts due me in the State of Virginia my will is that it
be Equally divided between my son John daughter Pally and
Luanda Cam daughter of my first wife Except the Expence
of collecting said debts that I allow my son John my wife
that I give I allow to be paid out of the Estate I leave to my
wife and appoint my son John Executor of this my will and

Baird and Eason Walker Commissioners appointed by the County Court January term 1861 to settle with Mary Pittenger widow of Edward D. Stone took the oath required by Law given under my hand this 17th of January 1861 Samuel Brown J. P.

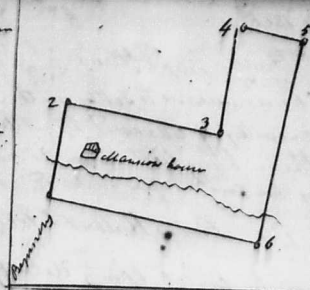
In pursuance of an order issued by the Honble the County Court of Bullett County July term 1861 the Craven Peyton Eason Walker and Joseph A. Baird Commissioners met July 17th 1861 in order to settle with Mary Pittenger late widow of Edward D. Stone Decd. and being first sworn proceeded to lay off her right of dower in 170 acres of land now occupied by P. Mary Pittenger which is represented in the annexed plat and bounded as follows (1861) beginning at a bush marked W. Thence N. 77° 50' 50" to a stake Thence N. 11° E. 78 1/2' to a stake Thence N. 79° 11' 54" to a bush and dogwood in Jones' line Thence with P. line N. 11° E. 31 1/2' to a dogwood and white oak corner to John Smith's Thence with his line S. 79° 11' 54" to a bush in J. A. Baird's line Thence with his line to the beginning including 45 acres we also proceeded to settle the debts of Edward D. Stone Decd. with the Executrix and allowed her to pay the debts owed by the Decd. which amounted to two hundred and twenty two dollars and fifteen cents which amount was taken out of the principal Estate which left a remainder of \$778.99 that we divided into three parts giving her dower which amounted to \$273.33 which leaves \$505.66 clear of any debts to the heirs of said Edward D. Stone Decd. We hereby enclose the said bill and papers submitted by the Clerk of the Sale of the property of the P. Edward D. Stone Decd. sold on the 18th day of January 1861 given under our hands this 19th day of January 1861
