Clithin Executors of this my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have signed at my home and seal this day of ^{11th} ~~12th~~ ^{13th} ~~14th~~ ^{15th} March 1830

Agreeably to an order of the Bullitt County Court made at the March Term 1830. to us the undersigned directed after being duly sworn have settled with Joseph Hardman administrator of Jonathan Hardman decd - on investigation of said Estate we find that after have come to his hands to the amount of four hundred and eighty dollars eighty five Cents. We find by Exhibits produced by the admin as claims paid off and charges against the estate amount to the sum of Eight hundred and twenty two Dollars twenty five Cents, leaving the Estate behind or in debt, in the sum of Three hundred and fifty and eight Cents. Out of which sum the Administrator claims the sum of two hundred and five Dollars seventeen & a half Cents as money paid out of his private funds and labor done individually, and his claim or allowed as admin \$20.17 1/2 Cents. We find that all the claims against the estate except the \$20.17 1/2 Cents have been discharged by the estate which came to the hands of the admin and the rest of the claims. George Saunders now deceased and it being my wish to make the legacy of each
 of my children equal and the whole of the said land being valued at one hundred and four
 hundred and fifty Cents Dollars. It is my Will and desire and I hereby bequeath unto
 the Children of my late George Saunders to be equally divided between them the sum
 of his hundred and forty Dollars and fifty Cents. And I will and desire to my
 Daughters Harriet Saunders the sum of two hundred and ten Dollars and fifty
 Cents (being the difference in the valuation of her Land) to be paid as follows
 John W. Saunders is to pay the sum of five hundred and sixty four Dollars and
 fifty Cents and Sarah W. Saunders and sixty Dollars and fifty Cents the money
 hereby bequeathed to the children of my late George Saunders &c. is to be placed in the
 hands of my son John W. Saunders as Trustee and Guardian for said Mary
 son George Saunders having received personal property to the amount of two hundred
 and thirty Dollars Joseph Saunders for the amount of One hundred and thirty two Dollars
 Abner W. to the amount of One hundred and thirty two Dollars and John W. Saunders to
 the amount of sixty Dollars It is my Will and desire that all my personal property
 (after my wife shall take her thirds thereof) shall be sold and after the payment of my
 just debts and funeral expences and paid that the said Abner W. Joseph Saunders & John W.
 Saunders and Harriet Saunders shall each receive a sum of money so as to make the amount
 to each of two hundred and thirty Dollars (received by my late George as aforesaid and the balance
 of the money arising from the sale of the personal property as aforesaid is to be equally divided
 between the said John W. Saunders Harriet Saunders Joseph Saunders & Abner W. and the Children
 of George Saunders &c. which I desire to them and their heirs forever &c. After the death of my
 Wife Mary Saunders it is my Will and desire and I hereby direct that my two negroes Dick
 and Nancy shall be free from all servitude to any person or persons whatsoever &c. After the
 third of all my income including Rents now in the possession of the Children of George Saunders
 &c. begins in the possession of Abner W. and Dick in the possession of Joseph Saunders &c.
 shall have been made it is my Will and desire that the balance of them shall be equally divided
 between John W. Saunders Harriet Saunders Joseph Saunders & Sarah W. and the Children
 of George Saunders &c. which I desire to them and their heirs forever except the negroes to said
 Sarah W. which are hereby devised to her in the same manner in which the land in this
 Will is devised to her &c. After the death of my wife Mary Saunders the Negroes and
 personal property devolved to her is to be equally divided between my said Children & John
 Saunders Harriet Saunders Joseph Saunders & Sarah W. and the Children of George
 Saunders &c. the negroes hereby devised to Sarah W. to descend in the same manner
 as the Land in this Will devised to her Lastly I hereby appoint my sons John W.
 Saunders and Joseph Saunders & Executors of this my last Will and Testament (naming
 all others try and make in testimony) of which I have here to set my hand and seal this
 14th day of October 1825.
