dollar — Item 4th I Give & bequeath unto my son William Bayne the
sum of One hundred dollars together with What I have already given
him — Item 5th I Will and bequeath unto the Children of my daughter
Patsy daer the sum of One dollar a piece together with What I have
given unto Hinda Middleton her husband in her life time —
Item 6th I Give & bequeath unto my son John all my right & interest
to the land I gave him bought of Maister Catamung two hundred
acres also the sum of four hundred dollars — Item 7th I Give &
bequeath unto my daughter Patsy, Walter, the sum of one hundred dollars —
