Burkhead, Elisha Sellings & Samuel Brown having met at the house of John Ricks on the 3rd day of October 1823 and as said order of the Butler County Court required being first sworn entered into a settlement of the estate of William Linnings deceased with Polly Linnings administratrix to said Linnings and do hereby report to said Court the said estate to stand thus:

The amount of said estate as appears to us by a Certified Copy of the inventory of the estate of said Linnings as found the Clerk of Butler County Court appears to be \$334.17 3/4.

Amount of payments made by administratrix as doth appear to us by receipts and other papers that are included in our report and will show to be \$315.17.

When payments deducted out of estate leaves a remainder in the hands of administratrix \$19.00 3/4 Cents.
